

(1580)

The marriage of Nicole d'Allard and Léonard de Suduiraut marked the rebirth of the Estate.

(1648-1653

Destruction by the fire of the old manor house at the instigation of the Duke of Epernon during the Fronde.

(1670)

Construction of a new château by Blaise de Suduiraut (grandson of Nicole and Léonard).

(1748)

Transfer of the estate to Joseph Duroy (Blaise's nephew).

The property becomes Château Duroy.

Completion of the works and layout of the gardens were inspired by the workshops of André Le Nôtre (Louis XIV's gardener).

1804

Joseph Duroy's grandson bequeathed his estate to his wife and then to his steward Nicolas Edme Guillot de Suduiraut.

1815

Land consolidation of the vineyard by one of his sons (200 hectares, including 100 hectares of vines). The estate was then renamed Château Suduiraut.

1855)

The estate becomes Premier Cru Classé of Sauternes.

1875)

Sale of the property to Henri Ferdinand Rabourdin.

(1879)

Henri Ferdinand Rabourdin passes Château Suduiraut to one of his daughters, Lucie Rabourdin.

1892

Lucie Rabourdin gets married to Emile Petit de Forest.

1892-1898

Modernisation of the vineyard and winery under the leadership of Emile Petit de Forest:

Creation of the cartouche on the pediment on the garden side containing the combined arms of the Duroy and Suduiraut families.

Construction of a new winery, giving Château Suduiraut the appearance it has today.

(1929)

Suduiraut becomes the property of Alfred Marie Adolphe Girodon Pralong following his marriage to Isabelle Petit de Forest, daughter of Emile.

(1940)

Sale of the château to Léopold François Fonquernie following the economic difficulties caused by the war.

Modernisation of technical facilities and implementation of a rigorous selection process during the harvest.
